"I think the City of Slaton's got a lot riding on this. We have a lot riding on it — we've already spent lots of money, you know, for awards and T-shirts and stuff — so we want it to happen, and this is our 25 anniversary and so we were hoping to make it bigger and better," Povlich said, chuckling. "But we're just going to have to kind of play it by year."

As of press time Tuesday (July 14), Nowlin said she had created masks to hand out to patrons who came to the show if they did not have one, and encouraged all to wear masks and social distance.

The plan is to host the event normally, with a few adjustments.

Slaton Chamber of Commerce member Leslie Linker said extra precautions will be taken at the show such as hosting a limited number

of vendors, asking attendees to social distance and wear facial masks or coverings, setting up sanitizing stations and spacing both vendors and show cars further apart than in recent years.

"We truly hope everyone will get a chance to walk through and see the cars, grab something awesome to eat, wave and send 'air hugs' to your friends — keeping six feet between you and them," she said.

Hosting this year's cruise and show is important to the community because it is the 25th anniversary, and proceeds benefit local charities such as Meals on Wheels, the Texas Boys Ranch and the South Plains Food Bank, according to the Caprock Classic website, caprock-classiccarclub.org.

"We want to congratulate (members of the Caprock Classic Car Club) and thank them for bringing the car show to Slaton every year. We are fortunate that they chose us," Linker said.

"They use the funds that generate from the car show to help various charities in the area."

The driving route will be the same as it has been in previous years, with cars moving around Town Square.

"It'll still go around the square, down to the Harvey House, back around past the road going past the bakery, down to the church and then turn around and come back," Povlich said.

Povlich said he is not expecting any major changes; everything is expected to go smoothly if everyone plays their part and is compliant with the new plan.

"We're hoping for something normal," he said. "I don't foresee anything changing a whole lot. I mean being in an open area, we're not limited to too much, but everybody's going to practice social distancing and stuff."

The cruise is set to take place from 7-8 p.m. Friday (July 17), and the show is

scheduled from 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Saturday (July 18) in the Town Square; Povlich said he is looking forward to

seeing what everyone has to show.

"We're always excited about the car show," he said.

"We get to see a lot of people from all over different places: Texas, New Mexico, and Colorado."

phone and vote on whether or not to open the center on Aug. 3."

The vote was 8-2 to delay reopening.

Williams said she agreed with the decision. "My choice, as Director, has always been to remain closed to not only protect the staff but to safeguard the seniors which attend the center. My concern is if someone comes to the center and unknowingly has the virus, multiple people could become infected. The health and well-being of the center participants is most important."

The decision will push back the opening to a later date, as they must wait 30 days from announcing to reopen per rules set in place by the South Plains Association of Governments. They said in order for the center to reopen, they must have a policy and procedure in place.

They do have a plan to prepare for the eventual reopening of the center, and are already taking steps.

"We have had a cleaning company in Lubbock offer to do a cleaning and sanitizing prior to reopening the center. The tables and chairs have been arranged to allow for social distancing. We have located hand-sanitizing stations next to each restroom and have multiple units in the dining area of the center," said Williams.

"We have started taking temperatures of all volunteers and staff on a daily basis. Mary and Mona have stepped up the cleaning and sanitizing of the kitchen. We have purchased disposable bingo cards to use when we reopen."

Williams said the continuing closure will not affect Meals on Wheels or the current home delivered meals, as congregate meals are not allowed while closed.

She praised the workers for that success. "Since the center closed in March, the staff has been there every day doing what needs to be done, preparing and serving the citizens of Slaton needing a Home Delivered Meal. So long as the center is closed the staff will continue

to be there," she said.

However, finances are starting to get a bit tight, especially when serving 1,000 meals a month, which can put into question how long they can continue without donations.

"During this time we have lost a substantial amount of funding. One of the ways is the loss of being able to hold or host a number of fundraisers which is the main way we receive our funds to continue the Home Delivered Meal/Meals on Wheels program," said Williams. "We have also lost the suggested donations for the daily in-house diners. Donations are always welcome and now so badly needed."

"If you are a business and use plastic bags for customer purchases, would you kindly consider donating a box? They would be used to package the Home Delivered Meal/Meals on Wheels daily lunch," she added.

They've also made even food deliveries safer.

"We now have a contactless delivery system and are placing all the lunch items in a plastic sack. It's much eas-

ier for the delivery team and the meal recipients are very pleased because they do not have to juggle all the containers when bringing into their home," she added, saying they have had two businesses donate their time and services to help the center.

That said, Williams encouraged citizens to help out. "The citizens of Slaton can also help by volunteering to be a filler, hopper, or driver for the daily meal route. We currently have a six week rotation. Most of our volunteers come from our churches. The Slaton Care Center was driving a route and we have had to ask some members of other teams to volunteer a day," she said, adding they have a "share a week" team if one can only do a partial week. On-call volunteers are also appreciated by the center.

Those who are doing some spring cleaning during the closures can also find a way to donate treasures. "If you have cleaned your closets and have items that would be good for Bingo prizes, I will gladly accept them," said Williams.

When the center does eventually reopen, Williams said there will be some games that will not be allowed for the time being such as dominoes, Amtrak

and card games; however, there are new activities that are coming.

"We look forward to the day when the center will reopen," she said.
