



# Slaton Cross Country reflects on season

The Slaton Tigers' Cross Country teams may have finished their season in Regional on Oct. 25, but Head Coach Landon Sims said the results didn't reflect the hard work his Tigers put forth this season.

"The Regional meet was tough, this is a very competitive Region, It extends from El Paso to Fort Worth. Mae Simmons is a very tough course, in my opinion its harder than the State course in Round Rock," he said. "We ran on Mae Simmons three times - the Lubbock Invitational on Sept. 17, District on Oct. 12 and Regionals on Oct. 25. Every kid got better each we ran it, as a coach that's really all you can ask for."

The boys finished 17th and the girls 24th as a team in Regional.

The girls placed third and the boys second in District.

Both results Sims said were part of the teamwork the teams showed all throughout the season.

"This was a special season, and it really makes you realize why you get into coaching in the first place," he said. "We did not have a team District

title, although we had an individual in (Elijah) Culver, but these kids were a true team in every sense of the word.

"It was a family atmosphere, coming to practice everyday was fun. These kids made it that way," Sims added. "For the girls to make the Regional meet was very impressive. Nobody thought we had a chance to do that. They made up their mind and they competed their tails off at District.

"The boys went through a lot of adversity this season, we had some things happen where they could've given up a while ago, but they did not, they persisted and I am very proud of them."

The teams will graduate a total of four seniors - Kat Castillo for the girls, then Elijah Culver, Ivan Venzor and Curtis Holland for the boys.

Sims said each one was special, and he will remember them all fondly.

"I don't think I have ever coached a kid tougher than Kat. She guts it up every time she runs. I know there have been times when she was really hurting but she always fought through it," he said. "She is a great leader, we will miss her leadership not only

with our high school girls, but with all the girls in our program, several kids in both high school and junior high really looked up to her. I'm happy I at least have one more track season with her.

"(Elijah) came to us his freshman year and was our No. 5 runner. The summer between his freshmen and sophomore year, he worked his tail off and has worked hard ever since," added Sims. "I don't think I've ever coached a runner who works as hard as Elijah does. He was the perfect leader by example, he always had an inspirational word to say to the kids. Like Kat I am happy that I will have him for one more track season as well.

"Ivan has been in our program since his freshman year. The thing I have always loved about Ivan is, he just goes to work, doesn't gripe, doesn't complain, he has been great to coach. No matter what you ask him to do he just nods his head and does it. We will miss his hard work and dedication to our program.

"Curtis has really matured this year. There were times when he had some slumps this season, but he was always persistent and always showed

up and worked," Sims added. "He was a Regional qualifier last year, and he was very positive with our younger runners this year."

Now, Sims is looking toward track in the spring and next year's team.

"We will just keep trying to get better, obviously losing this Senior class will hurt, but the girls have everyone but Kat coming back plus we

have some Junior High kids that will be freshmen that will help," said Sims. "Kali Stafford, Alexa Melendez and Zuri Martinez are just freshmen, Kaitlyn Parker and Lillian Powell are sophomores (and) as juniors we will have Kira Cogburn and Meagan Hersom back for one more year.

"As far as the boys go, we will definitely be young next

year. We will be relying on several of our eighth grade boys to move up and help, which I know they will," Sims added. "Noah Rodriguez, as a freshman, finished second place to Culver by two seconds at District, so he will definitely be our leader. Jayden Jones is a freshman, Thomas Cardenas and Xavier Riojas are sophomores, Abram Bernal is a junior.

## Eagles lose heartbreaker to Coahoma, 27-26
